A Message from the Executive Director

If you've kept your ear to the ground lately, you may have heard that High Plains Library District purchased the Greeley Tribune building in October! Our goal is to have a section of the building open as a library within the next year. We are so excited to finally establish a robust downtown library and look forward to getting input from the community on how to best serve our patrons in this new location.

“Where are our lions?”

In travelling around our District over the last year talking to focus groups, this question had stuck with me. The community member posing the question mentioned that the New York Public Library has two lions out front, and they each have names. People in New York know the lions' names. “Where are our lions?” Our community expressed a need for a destination downtown library in Greeley. And that's what we are going to deliver, along with our own version of 'lions' (we will be gathering community input on what our mascots should be).

On a financial note, December 15 will mark the date our Certificates of Participation (COPs) are paid off. HPLD will be debt free – the first time in almost 20 years. This is the library equivalent of paying off mortgages on multiple houses! At the time our mill levy override was approved 20 years ago, our Board of Trustees promised the community that the District would lower our mill levy by \$1,000,000, and now that these COPs will be paid off, the Board is proud to deliver on that promise. In 2020, our mill levy will be reduced from 3.249 to 3.177.

This next year you can expect our HPLD Strategic Plan to continue moving forward and for HPLD to be reaching more and more of our amazing community. We have some exciting new projects coming up this next year – projects that span across the District, from Erie to New Raymer. This next year, we hope to see you in one of our libraries, at our booth at a community event, or maybe you we will come to you with our PopUp Library in your community.

No matter where 2020 takes you, we hope to be there to help every step of the way in any way we can.


