


Fairy Tales for Tots


STEAM Activities



Jack and the Beanstalk - Jack trades Bessie, the cow, for magic beans and grows a giant beanstalk. Watch your own beanstalk grow! It won't grow as tall as Jack's and you won't find a giant, a singing harp, and a goose who lays golden eggs but you will in the book.

Science - Learn about how seeds grow into plants

Spread out 5 cotton balls on the bottom of a clear plastic cup. Tuck in 4 beans between the cotton balls and the side of the cup. Add enough water to soak cotton balls. Place the second cup on top and tape the rim to hold the two cups together. You just made a mini greenhouse! Your child will be able to watch their bean as it sprouts and grows into a bean plant. Add more water as needed.




The Three Little Pigs - The three little pigs set out to build their own houses. One house is with straw, one is with sticks and one is with bricks. The big bad wolf is determined to get into the pig's houses, so he huffed and puffed to blow them down.

Engineering - Learn about the weight and use of different materials

Which of the houses was he able to blow down? Find out for yourself! Pretend you are the pigs and build houses with the straw, sticks, and blocks. Then pretend you are the wolf as you huff and puff and try to blow down each house. Using the provided straw blow on each house.

Which house moved easily with air from the straw? Which material was hardest to move? Why?



The Princess and The Pea - Once upon a time a prince wanted to marry a real princess. How would he know if she was a real princess? One day a young lady knocked on the castle door claiming that she was a real princess. The King and Queen put her to the test. Only a true princess could pass

this test! She slept on a giant stack of mattresses with a tiny pea tucked between them. If she feels the pea, she would prove that she was a true princess.

Math - Learn about patterns

Have your child finish stacking the chenille strip mattresses on top of the pea. Follow the pattern that the Queen started for testing the Princess. Learning about patterns is fun but also a fundamental part of learning early math skills.



The Frog Prince - A wicked witch turned the Prince into a frog and he must find the love of a princess to turn back into a Prince.

The Three Little Pigs

Place straw, sticks and blocks on the pigs houses and try to blow each one down. Which house was easy to blow down and which one was impossible? Why?



The Princess and the Pea

Cover the pea with mattresses (chenille strips) and follow the color pattern. Understanding patterns is a fundamental early math skill.
