CAN'T FIND WHAT YOU ARE LOOKING FOR?

Did you know there's a really easy way to get the materials you are looking for, even if HPLD doesn't own them? Well, there is! It's not ILL (Interlibrary Loan), or a purchase suggestion, it's **Prospector**! **Prospector** is a regional catalog of over 45 libraries in Colorado and Wyoming. Through **Prospector** you have access to over 34 million books, DVDs, CDs, journals, government documents, and other materials owned by these libraries.

If you search our catalog for an item and there are no results, simply click on the **Prospector** link at the top of your search results page and search for the item in the **Prospector** catalog that opens. You can search items by author, title, and keywords. The system is continuously updated from each local library catalog and shows current circulation status. Once you locate the item you want, click on


"Request It" to the right. A pop-up will appear asking you to identify your library, and you just scroll down and choose Alliance - High Plains Library District. Then click "Submit". You will be asked for your Name and Library Card number, and the HPLD library where you would like to pick up your item. Click "Submit" again, and you are done. It's that simple! Your item will be pulled from the library that owns it and sent free of charge to HPLD via courier. You will be notified when your item arrives at your preferred library, and you check it out using the barcode on the item. When you are finished, you return it just like any other item and it is sent back to its home!

Prospector is a great way to get all of the materials you want without waiting for it to possibly be purchased or received from ILL. You have control over your request, and it will arrive much sooner. A new way to get all the items you are looking for in the New Year! Give this amazing service a try!







HPLD offers Kanopy - a free on-demand video streaming service









The popular on-demand film streaming service Kanopy is now available for free at High Plains Library District. Library card holders can access Kanopy and sign-up to start streaming films instantly by visiting highplains.kanopy.com. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTv, Chromecast or Roku.

Kanopy showcases more than 30,000 of the world's best films, including award-winning documentaries, rare and hard-to-find titles, film festival favorites, indie and classic films, and world cinema with collections from Kino Lorber, Music Box Films, Samuel Goldwyn, The Orchard, The Great Courses, PBS and thousands of independent filmmakers. Kanopy's collection is extremely unique and they offer content that not only entertains, but educates, enlightens, and inspires.





A unique way to support women in all stages of breast cancer

When I first met Deanna Krausse from Colorado Knitted Knockers, I thought to myself, "Wow...this is one spirited and energetic woman!" It wasn't until Deanna shared her own experience with breast cancer that I was instantly inspired to get involved—as a volunteer knitter and an advocate.

What are *Knitted Knockers*? Knitted Knockers are a lightweight, handknit breast prosthesis designed for women who have experienced mastectomies, lumpectomies and radiation, and/or are undergoing reconstruction due to breast cancer. Typically, women are offered a silicone or latex prosthesis that many women say is uncomfortable to wear and can be quite expensive. A Knitted Knocker is knit (or crocheted - patterns are available in either version) from high quality yarn that has been tested for comfort, appearance, and durability—especially when worn against sensitive skin and incisions after surgery.

What is important to mention here is that Knitted Knockers are handknit, often by women who also wear them. They are free for the wearer and can be requested directly through *KnittedKnockers.org* or from physician offices and cancer care facilities. Colorado Knitted Knockers supplies many providers across Northern Colorado with Knitted Knockers. They come in a full range of sizes, and the wearer can adjust them for a custom fit. They can be machine washed and air dried and can even be worn for a variety of watersports.

Knitted Knockers.org is an all-volunteer organization that operates solely on donations of supplies, like yarn and PolyFiberFil for stuffing, and monetary donations for things like shipping and office supplies. Grants and donations also help support their outreach programs like traveling to Botswana where breast cancer rates are at epidemic levels. Locally, Colorado Knitted Knockers has received grants from organizations like UC Health Northern Colorado Foundation and My Sister Knits yarn shop in Fort Collins for yarn and supplies.

Immediately after meeting Deanna, I began sharing information about Knitted Knockers with my friends and family and asked the knitters in my life to get involved. It wasn't long before I started hearing from women around me that they are currently wearing Knitted Knockers themselves and how the handknit prostheses were making a huge impact in their lives. From Colorado to Germany, I have shared Knitted Knocker patterns and stories from the strong, brave women I have had the pleasure of meeting.

Are you looking for a way to get involved? On <u>March 23, 10am to 4pm, Centennial Park Library</u> will host an all-day knit-a-thon with Colorado Knitted Knockers. Whether you knit or crochet, or don't do either, members from Greeley, Fort Collins, Loveland, and the Denver area will join with patrons from around Weld County to knit, stuff, and package Knitted Knockers that will be distributed to women locally. Please join us for and hour or two (or more) to meet and talk with the women of Colorado Knitted Knockers and join other like-minded crafters who combine their love

of knitting and crocheting to support women in all stages of breast cancer.







Instant Cooking

What is an instapot, multipot, or Instant Pot® and why is it so popular? Many multipot models can steam, sauté, slow-cook, pressure cook, and even make yogurt. The instapot is known for helping you throw together a dinner at the last minute as it can cook a chunk of meat fast (40-90 minutes). The pressure cook function allows for short cuts, such as cooking dry beans without first soaking them overnight or for several hours. But you can cook just about anything in a multipot including cheesecake, pancakes, mac & cheese and much more.

Although instapots have been around for a long time, their popularity has skyrocketed in recent years due to its ease and multiple conveniences. The key to success with your instapot is selecting recipes in which softness and tenderness is the goal and which traditional cooking methods take hours. However, it is important to remember that although called an 'instant pot', there is still the usual prep time associated with cooking - vegetables must still be washed and chopped. Plus, the pot takes time to reach and release pressure, usually 10-30 minutes. While cooking traditional spaghetti and meatballs, the multipot may not be any faster than traditional methods; however, the meal can be made all in one

pot instead of the normal two or three pots required with traditional methods. Many recipes can be cooked using the pressure cook or the slow cook feature depending on what works best for your schedule. Another great feature of the multipot is using the pot-in-pot method in which a side dish is cooked in the multipot at the same time as the main dish in a separate baking dish or steamer basket. All these factors add up to time saved which is why the instapot has become so common in many households.

Lost on a Page ~ My debut into the world of publishing

In May of 2018, my book *Lost on a Page* was published as an ebook and trade paperback by Double Dragon, a small press based out of Canada. The official email announcing its release date came to me while I was sitting in a dentist's chair. (I mean, don't you read emails when you're getting your teeth cleaned?) But the long, winding road to that email began in 2013. Publishing a book takes a while.

Rather than go into a five-year biographical snapshot, I'll sum it up. In the early 2000s, I had written and produced three plays in my hometown of Amarillo, Texas. My least favorite was about an author whose writer's block had driven him to the brink. He began to hallucinate that his characters were coming to life, and they did not care for the direction he was taking this story. The premise was fine, but I believed I could improve it if I scrapped everything and started over with nothing but the idea. This time, I wrote it as a novel.



The new iteration told the story of a fictional detective who escapes from his mystery novel and seeks revenge on his author by traveling to the World Where The Books Are Written (The WWTBAW). His road takes him through other novels of various genres, and hilarity ensues.

Have you ever thought about getting into publication? Here are my take-aways:

It helps to enjoy the actual writing

I did a lot of it. After the initial draft, I typed up eight full rewrites. The good news is that each draft was easier than the last. Editing is far less exhausting than coming up with the initial text. Especially if you have a raging inner perfectionist. Fortunately, I do. It's like the Incredible Hulk... except the opposite in every way.

It also helps to enjoy reading

Narrative is a language, and fluency requires interactions. There is a lot of nuance and technique you'd never pick up from a style manual. A writer who doesn't read is like a chef who doesn't eat. Maybe not a direct parallel. Not reading won't kill a person as quickly as not eating, for one. But I wouldn't trust that guy to cater a big event. That's all I'm saying.

Community is critical

I am a member of the Northern Colorado Writers, and I contribute to their blog monthly. I also have a talented critique group who point out all my flaws. And I'm grateful to all of them. I would not have published a novel without them. Northern Colorado is full of talented writers. There are groups that assemble regularly in library meeting rooms across our district. The Northern Colorado Writers holds a conference every spring where you can meet literary agents, editors and tons of other writers.

Resources are available

There is no shortage of materials to guide budding authors. *The Writer's Market* is full of information on agents, publishers, contests and good advice. I read several books on revision, and I would recommend James Scott Bell's *Revision and Self-Editing* among others. There are endless numbers of blogs and articles from credible sources to answer your questions. In short, you don't have to be great at it from the start. Honestly, you probably won't be. Want to see my first drafts? Well, you can't! Because I burned them. And they **deserved** it! But, I wouldn't have a book without them.

The High Plains Library District also sponsors a Writer-In-Residence each year to help local writers launch their writing careers. It is currently in its fourth year. Maybe that's the jump-start your writing needs. We'd love to hear from you. Keep an eye out for the next entry form on our website.

In the end, I just love books

I had a story to tell, and I wanted to do my best to bring it into the world. I chose to sign with a small press, because that was the method that best aligned with my vision for the book. It took a few years and some additional revisions before it got picked up. There are other options, though.

Here are the basic options:

Self-publishing is losing some of its stigma in the Amazon era. It can certainly be the shortest route, and if you an entrepreneur who likes to hold the reigns, this might be for you. As a reader, I still have to sift through self-published titles to find the good stuff. Four Color Bleed by Ryan McSwain and How to Break an Evil Curse by Laura Morrison are a few of my favorites. Sadly, you can't purchase Morrison's book at the moment, but her latest novella Come Back to the Swamp is available in our libraries and easily worth a read.

Small publishing houses can be easier to get into some ways, harder in others. For one, they don't take on as many titles as large houses each year. I feel the author gets a little more say in the finished product, but that's only based on my own limited experience. Some require literary agents, others don't. A few members of my critique group have also recently signed with small houses. The Five Wishes of Mr. Murray McBride and The Town with No Roads – both by Joe Siple, All the Broken People by Amy Rivers, and Story Bends by Sheala Henke were all released last year.

The Big Five publishing houses are Hachette Book Group, HarperCollins, Macmillan Publishers, Penguin Random House and Simon & Schuster. If you're going to go big, you've got a long road ahead of you. You will most definitely need a literary agent and lot of patience. ("Patience of a saint" to quote one literary agent I met.) You may be required to make alterations to the story before it is accepted. But, on the upside, you would have a large company full of qualified professionals behind your book to help it be as successful as possible.

Figure out which road is the best for you and full speed ahead.

Black Holes

How do you take a picture of something that is not there? In the case of a black hole, a picture of something that absorbs light itself?

On April 10th, 2019, the first picture of a black hole was taken the same way you would take a picture of a hole in a doughnut, by taking a picture of the doughnut surrounding it.

Scientists operating an array of eight ground-based radio satellites around the world dubbed the Event Horizon Telescope, looked towards a spot 53 million lightyears away, in the M87 Galaxy.

A 26-year-old MIT graduate, Katie Bouman, helped develop the algorithm needed to capture the snapshot, processing 5 petabytes (5 million Gigabytes) of data into an image of a swirling mass surrounding a black singularity.

The monster black hole swallows 90 earth sized masses every day and it is this debris falling in that allows us to visualize what a black hole really is for the first time.

Although the picture is a bit blurry, it will without a doubt, inspire a generation of young scientists, mathematicians, engineers and astrophysicists for years to come, and some day students will compare our simple photograph to the crystal-clear images they will surely have access to.

Paws to Read: A Chance for Young Readers to Read Out Loud to Some Very Attentive Listeners

It all began with a shy, reluctant reader, a quiet cozy spot on the floor, a tail wag, an ear scratch, and a book.

In a little over a year, I watched this timid, struggling reader soon grow into a reader who found not only an unknown ability but an actual enjoyment of books. This new-found joy grew even further. This now confident student decided to drop in on their elementary school principal suggesting that Carbon Valley Regional Library's Paws to Read program be something shared in their school newsletter right away. Just 15 minutes once a month sitting with a trained and certified therapy dog; just 15 minutes with a kind, quiet companion was all it took to help create a lifelong reader.

Reading, especially reading out loud, can be intimidating for anyone. For a young reader who may be struggling, the stress of reading out loud in front of peers or adults can create an endless cycle of anxiety and low performance and can even stop them in progressing in their reading, and ultimately, their learning development.

The Paws to Read program at Carbon Valley Regional Library is just one example of the many therapy dog reading programs available at High Plains Library District. More and more libraries, schools, and even universities are finding that the best thing you can do for a struggling or stressed student is to provide them with a calm, accepting therapy dog. What better audience than one that listens without judgment, one who is always patient, always kind, and always ready to be read to?

This program gives our young readers, at any reading level, a chance to read out loud in a stress-free environment to some very attentive listeners. Therapy dogs visit once a month and are always ready to hear some good stories. Therapy dogs sit quietly and calmly while children read aloud to them, allowing children to become more relaxed and

allowing children to become more relaxed ar confident about reading.

So, ask your local library about their therapy dog reading program. Your reluctant reader can come in, find a quiet cozy spot on the floor, scratch an ear, and read a book to a calm, attentive new friend.

Staff Spotlight: Carolyn Valencia and Stories, Songs, and Stretches!®

In January, Outreach Librarian, Carolyn Valencia, received one of seven Vividhatā Scholarships (diversity scholarships) to attend the online training **Stories, Songs, and Stretches!**® This training was founded in 2018 by Katie Scherrer, MLIS, RYT after the 2017 publication of her book *Stories, Songs, and Stretches! Creating Playful Storytimes with Yoga and Movement.* Katie is a former children's librarian, an early childhood education trainer, and a Registered Yoga Teacher who focuses on teaching yoga and mindfulness to young children and those who care for them.

Stories, Songs, and Stretches!® is inspired by the model offered by yoga of engaging the whole child – body, heart, and mind. It is informed by emerging science in the fields of child development, education, and mental health that shows that techniques that speak to each of these areas of development simultaneously can actually enhance early learning beyond what can be achieved by focusing on any one area in isolation.

Upon completion of the course, and after completing and self-evaluating three Stories, Songs, and Stretches services, Carolyn Valencia has the opportunity to apply to be a certified Stories, Songs, and Stretches facilitator.

"I am so very excited to create and share embodied play experiences that boost young children's development in physical literacy, early literacy, and social-emotional skills through yoga-inspired movement. Additionally, I believe this training will help me bring mindfulness through intentional activities and stillness to children in my community."

A Message from Katie Scherrer, Founder of Stories, Songs, and Stretches!®

Stories, Songs, and Stretches!® was born out of my love of yoga and mindfulness and my fascination with early learning. The first five years of life are so critical for the brain development that lasts our lifetimes. My vision is to see an entire generation of mindful kids who are school-ready in body, heart, and mind. That's where Stories, Songs, and Stretches!® comes in. It's all about understanding whole child early learning - physical literacy (body), social-emotional learning (heart), and early literacy (mind) - and from that understanding, using yoga-inspired movement and stillness as tools to support the development of those skills. The end result is the creation of embodied play experiences that are imaginative and fun while deeply grounded in intentionality. An extra benefit is the way these tools affect staff, reducing compassion fatigue and burnout, and reconnecting them with their passion for serving young children and families. There are big things coming for Stories, Songs, and Stretches!® in the next couple of years, including the release of video resources and original kids music, and a pilot study with a major research university to assess the effectiveness of the program in a data-driven manner. Reading Buddies

"Reading Buddies is an amazing opportunity to work with kids and earn service hours at the same time!"

"I like how much the little buddies look up to you"

"I wish the program continued through the school year!"

These are some of the comments received by teen big buddy volunteers.

The Carbon Valley summer Reading Buddy program began seven years ago with five pairs. Last year's program was the largest with 18 registered pairs and this year we have 15.

Reading Buddies is an eight-week program that pairs young readers (1st-3rd grades) with teen big buddies ages 13-17. The program begins with a training session for the Big Buddies. Each session starts with 30 minutes of teen time which consists of ice breakers and discussion meant to bring the teen volunteers together. The little buddies arrive for their hour of reading, bonding and then whole group time.

Liz Cook and Lorraine Schierer, both Library Associates at the Carbon Valley Regional Library tag team this program. They both agree that it is such a positive program on many different levels: it offers teens the community service hours that they are required to have for school, or for scholarships, it also allows them to be somebody important to a young person. The teens are encouraged to remind parents the night before a session, and also, to schedule a makeup session if either needs to miss. Based on an end- of- program survey with the teens, the input received is not about the service hours but about the relationship they have built with their little buddy. Everyone starts out pretty timid, but in the end, they are laughing and chatting.

The eight- week session ends with an ice cream party, certificates for all and a "gift" that the pairs exchange. This is either a photo of them together or a journal that they have worked on during their time together.

Throughout the program Liz and Lorraine find creative ways to bring the teens together as a group; reminding them that this time with their little buddies is not school... But a time to have fun, share their day, and gently encourage reading.




Reading Buddies continued

Surveys with the parents have been very positive as well with a general theme of wanting the program to be offered in the winter as well as the summer.

It can be a challenging program as it is always down to the wire when it comes to having just the right number of pairs. Liz and Lorraine begin putting the big buddy applications out in the library in April 1st and promoting the program throughout the community May 1. Normally there is a waiting list for little buddies and we are down to the very last minute for big buddies. This year was just the opposite... This can be a little stressful as you can be tweaking the numbers up until the day the program begins.

Making Music in the Library

Libraries and music haven't always been a natural partnership. The clichéd version of the uptight librarian who is ready to shush anyone who makes a peep in the library would faint at the sight of libraries with recording studios and performance spaces where bands are even invited to play INSIDE THE LIBRARY! On this note (no pun intended), High Plains Library District is incredibly excited to be

part of the Take Note Colorado initiative that will help us bring more music and musical instruments to all library users and especially to our younger patrons.

Take Note Colorado is a statewide community initiative whose mission is to provide access to musical instruments and instruction to every K-12 student in Colorado. The initiative was launched in January 2017 under the leadership of former Governor John Hickenlooper and Isaac Slade of Denver band The Fray, who share the belief that we can all play a role in bringing music into the lives of students. Hickenlooper and Slade were joined by musicians, philanthropists, music industry leaders, government representatives, community and nonprofit leaders to help realize this vision.

One of the first opportunities HPLD had to work with Take Note was during this year's Summer Reading Adventure. The Take Note Music Experience visited Carbon Valley, Farr and Erie libraries where aspiring musicians from kindergarten to fifth grade could learn to play real instruments from local, professional musicians. The results were amazing! At the end of the three-hour session, the kids were invited to perform an original composition alongside the musicians and it was incredible to see the confidence and creative energy that they showed while performing for a room full of adults and their peers.

As part of the Take Note partnership, HPLD has also received donations of musical instruments and digital music software that will be used for programming starting in the fall. The benefits of putting musical instruments in the hands of young people are vast, including improved motor skills, development of memory, and increased self-esteem. Keep an eye on the upcoming district calendar for musical programs being held at a library in your area.

As a hobbyist musician myself, I'll admit that I'm a little bit biased about the joys of making music. Just like any other pursuit, it isn't without its challenges, but the rewards for your effort can be immense. I've always loved this quote from Jimi Hendrix about the work of making music, "Sometimes you want to give up the guitar, you'll hate the guitar. But if you stick with it, you're gonna be rewarded." Thanks to the work of the Take Note Colorado initiative, we're on our way to getting kids that sense of reward and hopefully making the library just a little bit louder.



YES!fest (Youth Engineering and Science Festival) Launches on September 21

Would you like to make a water wheel, play with a robot, build an irrigation channel and create a monster out of sand all in one day?

You can do all of these things and more at the High Plains Library District's inaugural YES!fest (Youth Engineering and Science Festival) on Saturday, September 21, from 10am to 3pm at the Greeley Recreation Center, 651 10th Ave, Greeley. Free parking will be available next door at the Union Colony Civic Center


"We are extremely excited to offer the Yes!fest to our Community", said Dr. Matthew Hortt, Executive Director, "The inaugural event will give families the opportunity to engage in hands on STEM learning, activities and fun. The event will expose children and families to the work of science and technology and allow them to gain confidence in their skills."

We love science and engineering so much that we decided to put together this FREE festival, which is geared toward families with school-aged children and features nearly 30 exhibitors who recognize the importance of STEM in the lives of young people. Featuring booths from the City of Greeley's Engineering Department, Lockheed Martin, Poudre Learning Center, Noble Energy, City of Loveland Department of Water and Power, Ball Aerospace, Girl Scouts of Colorado, PDC Energy, Stantec, Ditesco Services, the Society of Women Engineers and many more, YES!fest gives kids the opportunity to play, explore, learn, and be an engineer for a day.

Also on site, the Windsor High School Robotics team will be providing a hands-on workshop that teaches participants how to make a robot, and kids will also be able to interact with several pre-built robots.

Our light and optics room will allow participants to experience fun with mirrors, personal pinhole theaters, coloring in 3-D, writing with light (phosphorescence), and candy light (triboluminescence).

The West Greeley Conservation District will bring their amazing Riparian and River Water Study Trailer. This will be parked in front of the Greeley Rec Center and will provide an interactive look at water systems. Participants will learn about sediment transport, observe the making of a river and learn river functions, terminology, and how sediment is transported.

We will have several university-affiliated organizations, like UNC's Math and Science Teaching Institute, Rams Without Borders, and CSU's American Indian Science and Engineering Society to help participants find out how to connect to engineering careers, explore problem-solving activities and show that anyone can think just like an engineer.

Michelle Heffner, the president of the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE) at CSU, says, "What I like most about being an engineering student is that I get to learn so many different things across different fields of study. I have learned so much about all sciences, math, computing, social sciences, medicine, arts, history, and other humanities fields and the coolest thing to me is that I can combine my knowledge from any of these fields in order to create things, investigate questions that haven't been asked before, and better society. That's the core of engineering." If you stop by to see Michelle and SHPE, you will get to make a lava lamp, ink a leaf and create a "Stranger Things Monster". Michelle shared with us that until she went to a professional engineering conference while in college, she never saw anyone who looked like her - a Hispanic woman - working in the engineering field. She wants to be a role-model for young people who are considering a career in engineering.

Stantec Water Engineer Victor Sam says kids should, "Ask questions and then try it out! Why does it do that? How does it work? Does it go faster? Can I make it change back? Be curious! If you like something, you want to learn everything about it. Go ahead, I know you will be amazed and inspired!"

In addition to the numerous hands-on activities, there will be representatives from AIMS Community College and Front Range Community College to talk about the engineering programs at their schools. This is a great time for parents to ask questions about career paths, financial aid, and scholarship opportunities.

The concept of a community festival dedicated to engineering evolved from HPLD's involvement with Ready, Set, Create/Project Build, a National Science Foundation initiative. YES!fest 2019 aims to engage underserved and underrepresented community members and families in novel and meaningful ways. Through hands-on activities, we seek to create a change in attitude towards engineering, as a meaningful potential career option and as relevant in our everyday lives.

"Through the Ready, Set, Create! programs, the High Plains Library District recognized that we could engage and excite children about engineering as a possible future. However, we rarely caught the parents who also need to know that these careers are possible for their children. We are hoping that YES!fest brings all ages together to realize that in addition to engineering and science experiences being fun, that it's also a very possible career path for anyone who enjoys being curious problem solvers – being a math genius is not required," said Elena Rosenfeld, Associate Director of Outreach at the High Plains Library District.

Teen Tour 2019: Angela Aguirre ~ Millenial Mija

As you probably know, library services aren't always confined to within the walls of the library. Outreach services and special events like YES! Fest and our annual Signature Author event go outside the library to enhance our district's impact on the community and meet patrons where it's most effective. Another annual event that may be less well known to the public, but is no less impactful, is Teen Tour.

The reason it might be a little less well known than some other district-wide events is that Teen Tour is a collaboration between High Plains Library District and local high schools and middle schools which brings an inspirational figure – often an accomplished writer or artist - to speak to young people at school-wide assemblies or classroom workshops.

For schools on tight budgets, bringing in an outside presenter can often present a significant financial challenge. The beauty of Teen Tour is that we are able to defray many of the costs associated with an outside presenter by having them do up to 15 presentations at a variety of local schools over the course of a week. Coordinating travel and the scheduling of 15 presentations between schools across Weld County is no small feat, but past Teen Tours have been able to reach over 4,000 students across its five-day span, attesting to the value of the library's involvement in this type of event.

One of our most exciting recent Teen Tour performers was Native American dancer and musician Supaman, who visited local middle schools in the fall of 2016. Students were in awe of not only his artistic skills and presentation but also of his personal story of overcoming a familial history of substance abuse. After every performance he was mobbed by students looking for an autograph or a selfie to commemorate the occasion. Two years ago, internationally-acclaimed poet Joaquin Zihuatanejo presented at local high schools where he held audiences in rapt attention with his stirring poetry and inspired students to tell their own story through poems.

For this year's Teen Tour we are extremely excited to be bringing writer and activist Angela Aguirre from Los Angeles to speak at our local high schools. Ms. Aguirre is a fierce advocate for women's issues and issues involving people with disabilities. As a person living with mental illness, she is very open and candid about her struggle with ADHD, anxiety, and Bipolar Depression. Ms. Aguirre will be presenting workshops that are meant to raise self-esteem while opening students' eyes to the challenges being faced by their peers and the people around them. It promises to be an inspirational week of art and advocacy that will leave a positive impression on all students involved.


Terrifying Tales for Halloween

You don't have to look far to see that American pop culture is experiencing something of a horror renaissance. Recent hits at the box office include *IT, Midsommar, Pet Sematary, Us* and *Halloween 2018*, while the small screen has people flocking to *Stranger Things, The Walking Dead, Bird Box, American Horror Story,* and *The Haunting of Hill House*. Naturally, the trend reaches into the book world and with Halloween right around the corner, it's the perfect opportunity to dip into some darker tales. Below, we'll explore some of the biggest releases of the season that could take you anywhere from goosebumps to night terrors.

Horrifically Big Releases







Horror has a tradition of releasing big, wrist-straining doorstoppers that often become classics. These are stories with intricate, comprehensive worldbuilding and intensive character development. Think of *The Stand* by horror master Stephen King, *The Passage* by Justin Cronin, or *The Fireman* by Joe Hill. 2019 has its share of horrifically big releases: one from the sci-fi world, one from a name you won't find surprising, and one that you probably will...

The story follows a young boy who disappears for six days, and when he returns hears voices that have him unnaturally obsessed with completing a tree house in the woods by Christmas. The book has been called haunting, thrilling, and thought-provoking, and author Blake Crouch said it was like finding a classic Stephen King novel you hadn't read before.

• *The Institute* by Stephen King (Find the book <u>here</u>; and the audiobook <u>here</u>)


Stephen King has become a household name, and a new release is always an event. The Institute clocks in at 576 pages, and is a return to the "young kids fighting evil" format he made famous with IT. The story may bring to mind The Umbrella Academy, or even X-Men, as families with extraordinary children are attacked, the parents murdered, and the children placed inside the Institute. The staff there works to find the source of the children's power, and as long as they cooperate things don't seem so bad. But if they don't cooperate, the consequences are extreme, and some kids are never seen again.

Wanderers by Chuck Wendig (Find the book <u>here</u> and the ebook <u>here</u>.)


The largest of the three, Wanderers weighs in at a substantial 782 pages and uses every single one to build a post-apocalyptic world that may put you in mind of Stephen King's *The Stand*. The United States of this story is in the grip of a strange sleepwalking illness. The victims can't be woken, and are all heading to an unknown destination, surrounded by friends and family trying to protect them from a civilization that's collapsing more each day. Packed with uncertainty, violence, and social commentary, but no actual scary monsters, this is a great choice for readers who don't want to sign up for the darker corners of the genre.

Get Your Thrills with a Side of Chills







If you'd rather be creeped out and unsettled than attract actual nightmares, dark thrillers might be more to your taste. These pageturning, heart-pounding stories get your adrenaline racing, and might even have you jumping at shadows, but never quite cross the line into the truly horrifying. (At least for most readers. As in everything, follow your instincts!) Riley Sager has become famous for this kind of creepy thriller, with *Final Girls* being his most recognizable, and fan favorites like Gillian Flynn's *Sharp Objects* and Thomas Harris's *Silence of the Lambs* were groundbreakers in this category.

The Chestnut Man by Søren Sveistrup (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

The author of this Scandinavian noir story is best known as a screenwriter and the creator of the hit series *The Killing*, so it's no surprise that this book is already in development as a television series. Set in Copenhagen, Denmark, the police are searching for a serial killer known for his disturbing calling card of small stick figures made out of chestnuts and matchsticks and left at the scene of each murder. Finding the fingerprint of a long-dead murder victim at a new murder scene further complicates the case. A perfect match for fans of Stieg Larsson's Millennium books or Jo Nesbø's Harry Hole series.

The Luminous Dead by Caitlin Starling (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

This dark sci-fi thriller is a stand-alone debut that requires no commitment! Picture the claustrophobic, paranoid horror of the film *The Descent* with a hefty dose of the weird and trippy scares of *Annihilation* by Jeff VanderMeer, and that should give you a sense of what to expect here. A caver on another planet is deep underground, mapping mineral deposits while her partner keeps an eye on things on the surface. But she's increasingly suspicious of her partner's decisions and suddenly cuts off all communication with the surface, leaving her to find her way out of the labyrinthine cave systems alone. And to fight the feeling that she's somehow being followed in the dark.

Cold Storage by David Koepp (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

Author David Koepp is best known as the screenwriter for megahits like *Jurassic Park, Spider-Man,* and *Mission: Impossible,* so it shouldn't be any surprise that this adventure thriller was immediately picked up for the movies. This is science-based scary thrills, with a mutating biological organism running rampant and threatening humanity with extinction, unless a bioterrorism agent and two regular security guards can manage to create a quarantine. In a world of Ebola outbreaks, this is a frighteningly plausible thriller that might have you questioning every sneeze.

Short & Scary







Sometimes a nice short story or novella is exactly what you need, and it's a format that's been growing in popularity. Notable titles that pack a big punch without many pages include *Widow's Point* by Richard Chizmar and *Mapping the Interior* by Colorado author Stephen Graham Jones. And you can't go without mentioning legendary horror editor Ellen Datlow, who just released *Echoes: The Saga Anthology of Ghost Stories*. If you're pressed for time and attention, these tiny terrors could be just what you need.

• Full Throttle by Joe Hill (Find the book <u>here</u>.)

Joe Hill may be Stephen King's son, but he's more than made a name for himself in horror based on his own merit. He's gathered great reviews and satisfied readers through graphic novels, short stories, novellas, and full-length novels, and his fan base is set to grow. This collection of short stories includes "In the Tall Grass," which is being adapted into a Netflix movie due sometime this Fall, and "Faun," which Netflix plans on making into a movie. With AMC turning his novel NOS4A2 into a series, there's never been a better time to jump on the Joe Hill train.


Growing Things by Paul Tremblay (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

This collection of 19 short stories includes several that are connected to the author's popular novels, including one that acts as a prequel to *Disappearance at Devil's Rock*, and several that are connected to the award-winning *A Head Full of Ghosts*. While many of the stories had been published before, this is the quickest way to experience Paul Tremblay's experiments with horror, suspense, weird fiction, and even storytelling format. (Choose your own adventure, anyone?)

• The Monster of Elendhaven by Jennifer Giesbrecht (Find the book here.)

If you'd rather have a novella than a short story, Jennifer Giesbrecht has you covered. This is Giesbrecht's debut, and it's being described as an oily-dark, gothic revenge story. It takes place in a grim fantasy world where a thing with no name and a boy who can manipulate minds terrorize their community. If you enjoy bad characters working on bad plans, this is a one-sitting read that will satisfy your antihero cravings. But be prepared – this is a dark tale.

Cinematic Screams







The success of scary movies and terrifying TV series has sent Hollywood straight to the new book section to find their next big hits. Keeping track of what you might soon see on the silver screen can be time consuming, so let us share some of the titles we're most excited about seeing come to the movies, expand our favorite movie worlds, and help you keep track of what's out there.

A Cosmology of Monsters by Shaun Hamill (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

This one's being turned into a TV series by the team that made *Hidden Figures* and the *Planet of the Apes* movies. Whether you're a fan of monsters, haunted house attractions, or a modern take on H.P. Lovecraft, this story has something to appeal. It features a family being stalked by a monster, the haunted house they build to deal with the curse, and the one member of the family who chooses to invite the monster in.

Malorie by Josh Malerman (Find the book <u>here</u>.)

Fans of the Netflix movie *Bird Box* won't want to miss *Malorie*, which takes place eight years after the events of the film and focuses on Malorie herself. Although there aren't any plans announced to adapt this for the screen, it has a strong connection to one of the most successful Netflix originals. You never know what might be coming in the future, and in the meantime it could scratch that itch for more stories from Malerman's world.

• Fangoria (Find the book here.)

Truth Is More Frightening Than Fiction







Looking to take your horror appreciation a little further? We have some nonfiction picks that range from thoughtful guides to the genre to a joyful appreciation of the pulpier side of horror. Use these books to find more things to send chills down your spine, to better understand what scares you, or simply to learn how not to be the first to go should you find yourself unexpectedly living in a horror movie.

How to Survive a Horror Movie by Seth Grahame-Smith (Find the book <u>here.</u>)

This tongue-in-cheek guide is a must-read for anyone who suspects that they may be living in a horror movie. (Or just for horror movie fans, but it's more fun to pretend.) It includes handy tips for discovering what type of horror movie you've stumbled into, how to identify horror villains ranging from your standard slasher to haunted dolls or even aliens, and how to dodge all the classic horror pitfalls and come out victorious. If you can't avoid creepy cornfields or remote abandoned cabins, at least you can be prepared!

Paperbacks from Hell by Grady Hendrix (Find the book here.)

If you were a reader in the 1970s or 80s, this could be a nostalgic look back at the pulp horror that was popular at the time. If you weren't, it's a jaw-dropping look back at the sheer variety and outrageousness of the horror books being published. The book features hundreds of full-color reproductions of horror novel covers featuring creepy dolls, killer animals, and threatening skeletons, as well as hints about what holds up and what should stay in the pulpy past. Whether you enjoy reading horror or not, this is a fun way to spend some time.

Monster, She Wrote by Lisa Kröger and Melanie R. Anderson (Find the book <u>here</u>.)

Although horror is often thought of as a guy's genre, it's worth pointing out that Mary Shelley is usually credited with writing one of the first horror novels when she wrote Frankenstein. In fact, horror is packed with contributions from women for hundreds of years. Find new favorites from women you've heard of, like V.C. Andrews, to women you may not have, like Helen Oyeyemi, or women who have been largely lost to history, like Margaret "Mad Madge" Cavendish. Monster, She Wrote offers both biographies and reading lists for every horror fan.





How many weeks are so wonderful they happen twice a year? Hint: it's not Tax Identity Theft Week or Termite Awareness Week. It's not even National Library Week. It's Children's Book Week! 2019 is the 100-year anniversary of this celebration of children's books and the joy of reading. It's such a big deal that one week was simply not enough. The first celebration in 2019 was April 29 to May 5, and now we're getting ready for the second Children's Book Week, happening November 4 to November 10. We love celebrating children's books all year round; still it's wonderful to do something special to highlight the impact books can have on readers of all ages—especially young readers.

Children's Book Week is organized by Every Child a Reader and the Children's Book Council. It's the longest running national literacy initiative in the country. The theme for the 100th Anniversary is "Read Now · Read Forever" and we couldn't be more excited to get all the families in our community reading.

Most adults have a book or two from their childhood that they remember clearly. Or maybe they remember a book their own child loved reading—sometimes over and over and over again. If you've kept your ear to the ground lately, you may have heard that High Plains Library District purchased the Greeley Tribune building in October! Our goal is to have a section of the building open as a library within the next year. We are so excited to finally establish a robust downtown library and look forward to getting input from the community on how to best serve our patrons in this new location.

"Where are our lions?"

In travelling around our District over the last year talking to focus groups, this question had stuck with me. The community member posing the question mentioned that the New York Public Library has two lions out front, and they each have names. People in New York know the lions' names. "Where are our lions?" Our community expressed a need for a destination downtown library in Greeley. And that's what we are going to deliver, along with our own version of 'lions' (we will be gathering community input on what our mascots should be).

On a financial note, December 15 will mark the date our Certificates of Participation (COPs) are paid off. HPLD will be debt free – the first time in almost 20 years. This is the library equivalent of paying off mortgages on multiple houses! At the time our mill levy override was approved 20 years ago, our Board of Trustees promised the community that the District would lower our mill levy by \$1,000,000, and now that these COPs will be paid off, the Board is proud to deliver on that promise. In 2020, our mill levy will be reduced from 3.249 to 3.177.

This next year you can expect our HPLD Strategic Plan to continue moving forward and for HPLD to be reaching more and more of our amazing community. We have some exciting new projects coming up this next year – projects that span across the District, from Erie to New Raymer. This next year, we hope to see you in one of our libraries, at our booth at a community event, or maybe you we will come to you with our PopUp Library in your community.

No matter where 2020 takes you, we hope to be there to help every step of the way in any way we can.
